The HUG Annual Report 2016



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Continuous Activities

- This year 91 new patients were cared for whilst 33 we continued treating from the previous year. A total of 124 families were treated through 2016.
- Direct contact was maintained with some 250 family members.
- On average 32 patients were treated at any given time, with a peak of 42 during the summer which created pressure for our professional staff, however they did cope well with the influx.
- Pre-treatment advisory meetings continued to be offered to families outside the regular treatment cycle.
- The forum of families whose members were treated by HUG held its annual gathering.
- A group of bereaved spouses held six meetings during the year.
- Two third-year social-work students from the Tel Hai college joined HUG's staff for the year as part of their practical requirements.
- Medical students from the Safad Medical Center received guidance from HUG's staff and joined HUG's teams for home visits.
 Patient families were invited to Jewish Holidays celebrations together with HUG's personnel.



Staff Development

- Periodic staff meetings supervised by a professional psychologist dealt with compassion fatigue and caregiving situations.
- Personal meetings of staff members with the management team enabled mutual feedback and the cultivating of ideas for improvements and innovation.
- HUG's representatives participated in a series of professional forums and seminars exchanging knowledge and ideas with fellow professionals, e.g. Palliative Medicine workshop at the Hadassah Hospital; International seminar on Bereavement in Eilat; Hospice Day in Rambam Hospital; Psycho-oncology seminar etc.
- An Annual Working Plan was developed by the management in cooperation with the staff. A quarterly follow-up process monitored and supervised closely the implementation.
- A monthly Journal Club dealt with various practical as well as academic professional issues. Sessions led by both staff members and guest lecturers.
- Our annual staff trip was enjoyed a full day excursion involving social as well as fun activities

• Dr. Zarka, the incoming general manager of the Sief Hospital in Safad, met with HUG's team, learned about its activities and presented his vision on health services in the


northern periphery.
